Recent events

Visit to Eschweiler ⁻ 14-17 May

Early coach to Ebbsfleet + Eurostar to Brussels + local train to Welkenradt + mini van = arrival Eschweiler! It was a bit of a trek but went very smoothly, as around 20 of us managed to get to Eschweiler around 5pm to meet our hosts for this special weekend celebration.

We have been on a number of trips to Brunoy but this was our first time going to Eschweiler. We ve heard of the wonderful hospitality of our twin town in Germany and decided it was time to participate in this link for the 30th anniversary.

On arrival we met our hostess and had a relaxing evening getting to know her and another twinning couple. We had a lovely meal together and our conversations were peppered with English, French and a bit of German (since we aren't German speakers we were really just picking up some words here and there).

The next morning we were off to Brussels and the European Parliament by double decker coach, along with the Wattrelos contingent (who were also there to celebrate 40 years of twinning with Eschweiler). We arrived in Brussels to visit the Parliamentarium. Unfortunately we were unable to meet our MEP as planned, but we did get to see the exhibits and learn a bit more about the roots and formation of the European Union and what it stands for. There was also a 360 degree screen where you could sit as if you were in the chamber.

Next we headed into Brussels town centre for a walking tour in beautiful sunny weather ⁻ we were split up into language groups accordingly to learn a bit more about the city and history of Brussels. We saw the Royal Palace, the Grand Place, and various other sites and buildings around uptown and downtown. Unfortunately, we didn't have time to stop for their world famous frites, chocolates or beer!

On the way back to Eschweiler we stopped for a lovely meal together in a restaurant near the border (where we did finally get a chance to sample the Belgian beer). We were also presented with a German bottle of wine each from Eschweiler.

On Saturday we had the formal civic ceremony to commemorate the anniversaries of our twinning links. It started with a number of speeches from all 3 twin towns and in between we had musical interludes with an excellent saxophone group and musical entertainment. Afterwards we looked at the exhibition while drinking champagne and eating canap¶s. In the afternoon we all met together at a lakeside restaurant for a buffet meal before the evening ecumenical church service with a local church involved with the twinning. What struck me most about the speeches and the sermon, as well as from the exhibition at the European Parliament, were the ideals of the creation of the EU to bring people together for a common purpose and understanding. I was greatly impressed by the German willingness to address the painful past of the war while seeking co-operation between nations to prevent similar events from taking place again In future.

Saturday evening we had drinks, a meal and musical entertainment. Some danced (mostly the French I think). We all had a good time and the hospitality of Eschweiler was amazing. We certainly didn't go hungry!

S unday morning we headed back for our trek home by coach, train, E urostar and coach again (including the opportunity for a bit of shopping at Brussels E urostar terminal for that beer and chocolate we missed out on during our walking tour.)

E ven though we don't speak German, we really enjoyed our time with the Eschweiler group and getting to know them, their city and their country better. There was a real sense that twinning and the European Union both exist to help ensure peace and friendship between and amongst people and nations. Our German hosts take it seriously. We are looking forward to next year when they visit us and we can renew those friendships and return the hospitality.
