A very belated "Happy New Year" to everyone on this first 2019 issue of our newsletter! As usual we will participate in the Eschweiler Karneval later this month, together with a group from Wattrelos. This year it is a very international affair, as Prinz Paulo and Zerm. Pedro are of Portuguese origin although they have lived in Eschweiler for many years. We attended the Proklamation ceremony in January (when the Prinz begins his Karneval reign) where there was a large Portuguese contingent with the Portuguese Ambassador as this is an Eschweiler "First"!

The Prinz, Zerm. and some of the Karneval Committee also had the honour of being invited to Berlin to meet Mrs Merkel.
