♦ Spring walk 26 April


At the moment this is the informaton I have from Natasha Allan, who will lead the walk

Treasurer and Membership

Treasurer

The 2019 accounts were approved by the auditor without amendment. There was a substantial deficit for the year which was expected because of visits by both Twin Associations however the balance sheet still showed good reserves at the end of the year.

In the current year, subscription receipts for the year are lower than last year due to 8 members not renewing and 7 members who have not yet paid their dues. As it is so early in the Association year there has been little activity other than subscription receipts and the Reigate quiz in February which was a very successful fund raising evening although the hall hire charge is still to come.

Membership

We have 79 Memberships of whom 58 are subscription paying – the rest are Honorary Members and members of our twinned clubs. The 79 memberships represents 98 individual members/organisations.

Eight members have decided to leave the Association and seven members have not yet paid their subscriptions. If this is the case at 31st March their details will be removed from the database.
